Falcons have been very busy on Safer Internet Day.

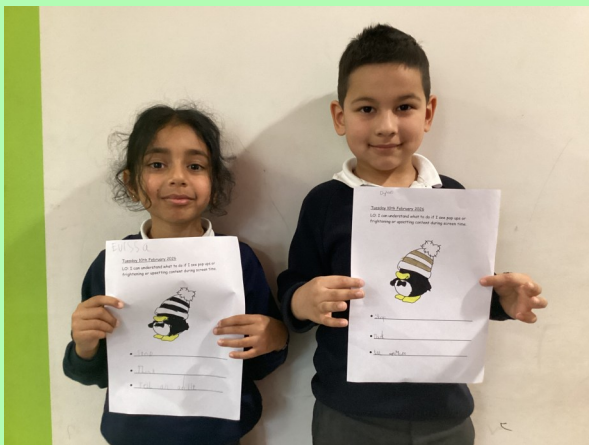
Let's take a look and see what the classes have been up to!

In Reception, they have been listening to stories about Smartie the Penguin, who learns how to stay safe on the internet. They talked about how to stay safe and learned a song to help them do this.

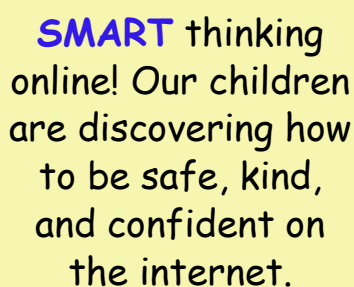
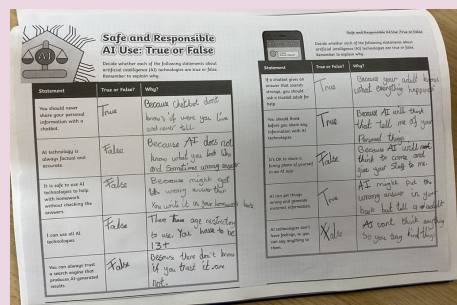
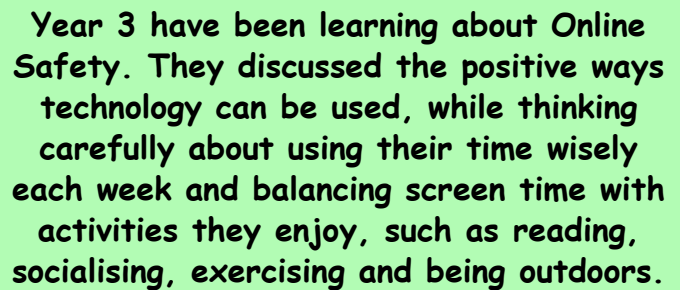
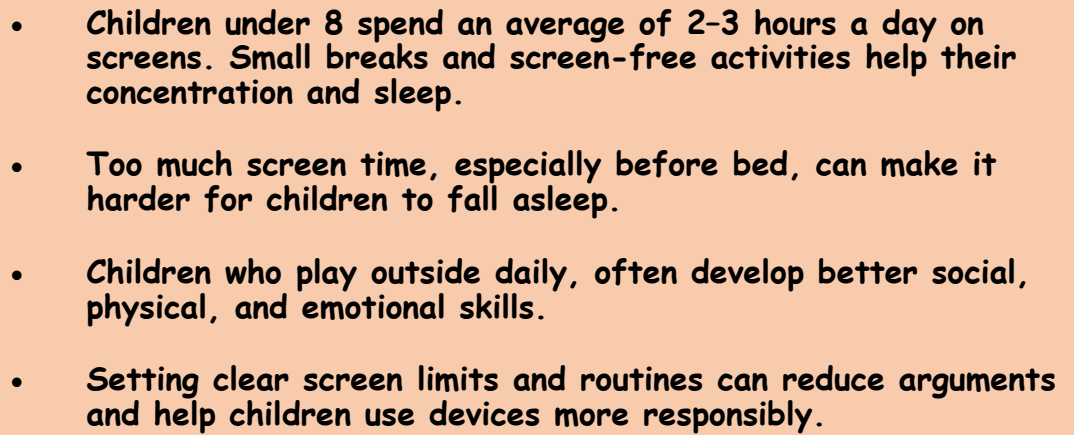


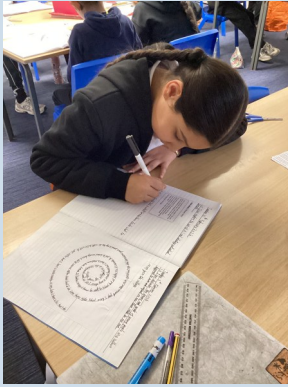
Year 1 children enjoyed reading 'The Adventures of Smartie the Penguin!'

Through Smartie's story, they learned what to do if they see pop-ups or anything frightening or upsetting online. They now know to Stop, Think, and Tell a trusted adult.

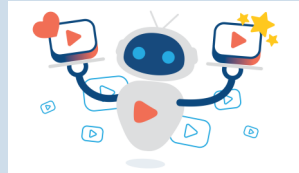
Children in Year 2 have been learning about Smartie the penguin's SMART rules when using the internet. They designed their very own information leaflet, informing others about how to stay safe online.



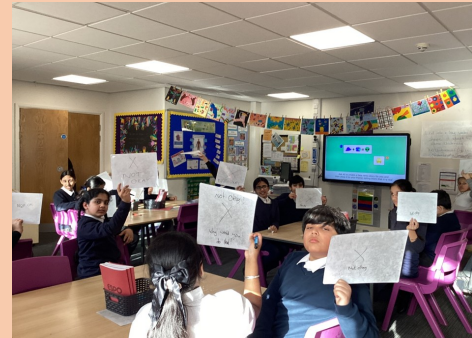




For Safer Internet Day, Year 5 explored the different uses of AI and discussed the benefits, the potential risks and came up with their own rules on how to keep safe online.
