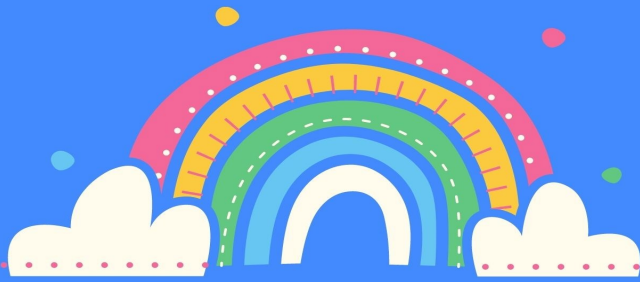

IMPORTANT NOTICES

Parents, please note the following points:

- ⇒ Please **PARK CONSIDERATELY**, not on double yellow lines, zigzags, or blocking pavements or driveways.
- ⇒ **BE PUNCTUAL**. Gates open at 8:20am and your child needs to be seated in their class by 8:30am at the latest. School ends at 3:00pm so please pick your child up on time.
- ⇒ **RESPECT STAFF** by waiting for them to say your child's name to dismiss them at home-time. This is to keep all children safe.
- ⇒ **WRITE YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON ALL BELONGINGS**, especially clothing items.
- ⇒ **BOOK ON TIME**. Breakfast Club and Aftercare, school dinners and places on the bus should all be made by the end of Thursday for the following week. Please contact office staff as soon as possible on Friday if you have any issues with booking.
- ⇒ Ensure that you send a **HEALTHY PACKED LUNCH** for your child and **FRUIT** for morning break.
- ⇒ **CHECK UNIFORM, PE KIT AND SHOES** are in line with school expectations. Children may bring a **SMALL BAG OR RUCKSACK** to school only if needed.
- ⇒ Notify the office promptly about any **CONTACT DETAIL CHANGES**. We must be able to contact you easily in an emergency.
- ⇒ **WELCOME MEETINGS** are important so please attend these. Dates are at the end of this Newsletter.
- ⇒ **GIFT A BOOK** to your child's class if you would like to celebrate your child's birthday in school. Your child can choose any age appropriate book or one from the recommended list which teachers will send out. Books will have a special label with your child's name on it stuck inside. We will no longer be accepting party bags, gifts or snacks for children's birthdays: although we appreciate the generosity, we don't want families to feel pressure to provide these. We are also keen to use every opportunity to build a love of reading in our school. Don't worry- teachers make sure that birthday children are recognized on their special day and all birthdays are celebrated in style during Friday assemblies!

The Ospreys (2SM) have really enjoyed getting to know each other through fun outdoor games and have been working on their team building skills.

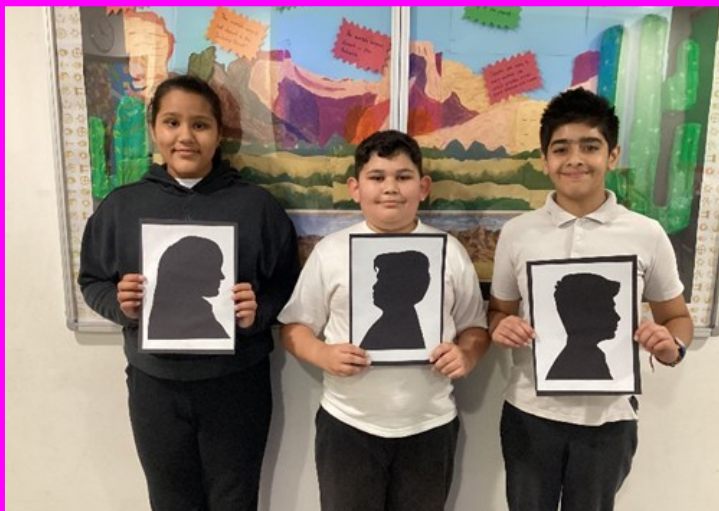

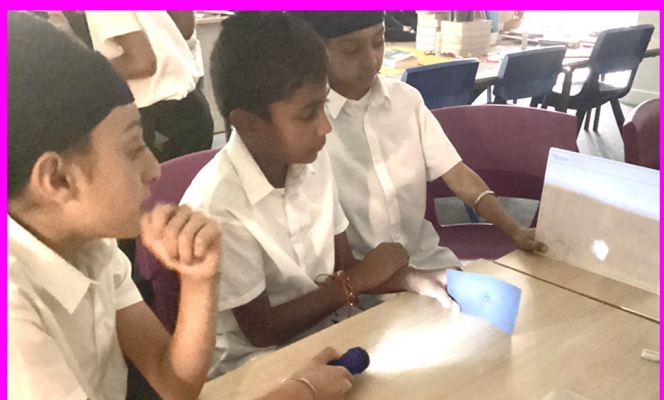
During PE, the Jays (5GV) had fun developing their communication, cooperation, and teamwork. They took part in a creative activity, working together to recreate an image using their bodies.
